- affairs of the cities


Disciple – defined:

Disciple: a student or follower of Jesus Christ



- Free individuals living together = society (Thomas Payne)

- The contract binds people into a community that exists for mutual preservation.
- We sacrifice physical freedom to gain civil freedom (rational thought!)
